The Problem







Scaling and Scoping

- Scaling development is in general a bad idea
 - 40% loss in capacity going from 1 team to 2
 - Need to double staff to get back where you started
- Scoping extends the span of communication
 - The same problem as scaling
 - Marketing, HR, management, external plant, security, legal...





What Are Scale-Free Networks?

- They tend to have a high number of *hubs*
- Long tails in the distribution of node degree, with some nodes an order of magnitude larger than the smaller nodes
- The hubs tie together communities of leaves (and maybe a few other hubs)
- They tend to be flat so they have low graph diamater (the largest number of hops from any node to any other node) and the diameter remains constant as the graph grows (scale-free)



Hubs Reduce Graph Diameter






(a) Random network




What Are They Good For?


- They are robust they tend to survive random link breakages
